Broadway Honors Louis Twyman for his Caring Counseling Ministry

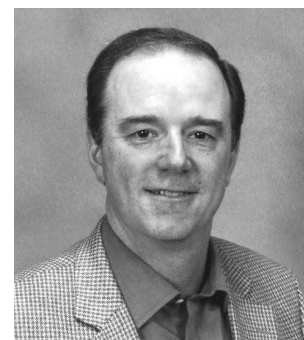
Twelve years ago, Louis Twyman began his counseling ministry at Broadway. Since then, scores of people have known there is someone who cares enough to listen to them, pray with them, and help them find their way.

When Louis agreed to serve, the arrangement was that we would provide free office space, and that he in turn would provide initial counseling sessions to Broadway members free of charge. He has long been very liberal in how he interpreted "initial counseling sessions." His generosity in giving freely of his time to so many has had an immeasurable impact on people and their families.

The Psalmist frequently asked God to listen to him and to be near him. During hard times, God's presence can be harder than usual to sense. During those hard times, Louis was able to be a holy presence to people in valleys.

On June 1, Louis retired from Broadway's counseling ministry. In recognition of his healing ministry in our church and in our community, the deacons of the church recently voted to name the counseling area the Louis Twyman Center. We will be honoring Louis in the 11:00 a.m. service on June 14, and there will be a reception in the atrium in honor of Louis, Lou Ann, and their family following worship. Please be sure to thank Louis for all he has done!

On a separate note, my thanks to you for your generous response to our recent financial struggles. While challenging times may still lie ahead, your generosity during the latter half of May is a hopeful sign.

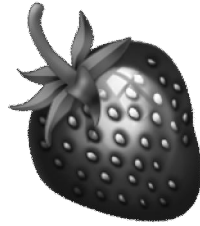

Golf Scramble Winners

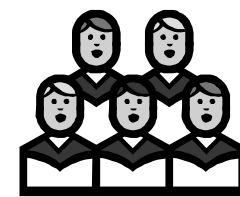
The Recreation Team would like to recognize the big winners from its golf outing that was held on May 16 at the Heritage Hill Golf Club.

craft activity each week during the summer. Becky Caswell-Speight, minister to children and families, will have materials and instructions for each week's craft in the CLC craft room.




Beginning in July, we will publish *Off Broadway* monthly on the first Tuesday of every month. Janet Hymer will edit this newsletter, which will be eight pages and will be in full color. This longer format lets us offer deeper content, articles from all ministers, and more photos.

The newsletter will be distributed via e-mail if we have your e-mail address on file. If you would prefer a paper copy, please let the office staff know. If we have no e-mail address on file for your household, you will receive a paper copy in the mail.

E-mailing the newsletter will speed up delivery, improve photo quality and eliminate postage costs. It also allows families to receive multiple copies. College students can receive a copy while at school. And, if you travel to Florida (or elsewhere), you'll still get your copy right on time. It's also a great outreach tool if you want to forward the newsletter to a friend.

We will also produce a weekly e-mail publi-

cation to keep you up to date on announcements and calendar items. This publication will only be distributed by e-mail.
